Presentation by Mark Kluckow

The Std 7 pupils were fortunate to be given a presentation on Leadership Skills by Mark Kluckow, a clinical psychologist from Zimbabwe. He started off by asking the children what their definition of a leader is and this summoned up some good answers. He then questioned them on who they considered to be good leaders and besides the more obvious answers, there were some interesting selections!

They were then divided into groups and given an interesting practical problem to solve. This caused a great amount of thought and considerable hilarity, but not one group was able to solve the problem. He then told a group of children, who had been told the solution, to go and advise. Even then, only a few managed to solve the problem. The lesson learned from this, was that even if you have been given a position of authority, it doesn't necessarily mean that you can lead a group, but that anyone armed with a bit of knowledge, can be a successful leader.

The main thrust of the talk was a reinforcement of one of our main Std 7 aims - that is, that everyone is a leader. The rest of the school look up to each Std 7 pupil to be a role model. He stressed that you do not have to be loud or domineering, but showing care and concern, is the form of leadership we should all aspire to.

We were also privileged to have a session on bullying with Mark Kluckow with all children from Reception to Std 6. The important message here was that, whilst very few of us will escape some form of bullying throughout our lives, at school, it is something which can easily be eradicated.

The session was interactive and Mark initially asked the children the meaning of a 'Bully.' The responses were good and a wide variety of definitions were given, pertinent ones too, in our age of social media.

The practical aspect came when Mark used himself as an example of a bully, and his wife, Joy, was used as the victim. This naturally caused much laughter, but the underlying advice was quickly absorbed. He then used various children from the floor to come to the assistance of Joy and in this way showed the children that no matter how strong the bully is, if there are sufficient numbers coming out in support of the victim, the bully will be beaten!

He gave the children an easy slogan to learn, that of ABC – Anti-Bully Champion. The children latched on to this immediately! The other acronym he taught us was TAT –Tell A Teacher. He stressed that to tell your teacher of bullying that is going on, is NOT telling tales, but is the responsible thing to do, in order for positive action to be taken. We hope that ABC and TAT will become part of all our children's subconscious.

We trust, that with the excellent advice given to us by Mark, that any form of bullying will quickly be stamped out.
